We are saddened that we will be losing additional staff members as Larry and Sharilyn Herren have announced their retirement date of April 30, 2017, having served in this ministry for twenty-five plus years, the first eleven as houseparents, and the remaining years as Maintenance Supervisor and School Secretary/Computers respectively. We are grateful to them for their service and dedication, and wish them well as they move into the next phase of their lives.

There are still have many challenges that lie before us, but with God's help, blessings, and guidance, He will continue to provide for our every need, just as He always has. With renewed zeal and dedication of spirit, we are excited for the opportunity to "Spring Forward" with our plans for the future growth and influence of this agency.

just love spring, don't you? The birds start singing, the grass begins turning green, the trees start budding and the flowers start blooming. It is a time of renewal.

That renewal is what I am seeing here at Shults-Lewis. Both the staff and the residents seem to be in better spirits especially when they start seeing the beauty of God's handiwork all around them.

It is also at this time of year that social services sees an upswing in the number of prospective placement calls we get from DCS and from parents who are at the end of their rope and don't know what else to do with their teenagers. Shults-Lewis is usually the parents' last hope in helping them deal with this crisis. It makes us happy to know that we can help families, not only with their children. but to help them manage their own emotions and behavior in dealing with their families overall. I know I can speak for our whole department when I say that I believe this is the work God has lead us to and that He has blessed us with doing.

The work only just begins once a child is placed at Shults-Lewis. The residents are placed in one of our on-campus homes with a Christian husband and wife team called Houseparents. Houseparents try to model a Christ-like example of how parents should conduct their lives and interact with their children. For many of our residents, this is the first time they have ever lived in a two-parent, Christ-centered, functional environment. It is indeed a period of growth and change for both the residents and their

families. Residents also attend our on-grounds school every day, participate in gym class, and have therapy throughout the week. We are changing our program somewhat here at Shults-Lewis. As we continue to keep our foundation of God's love, we have begun utilizing a new model called Sanctuary. We want to build on the foundation that has been laid here at Shults-Lewis over the past 60 years. We are trying to utilize the research and knowledge we have learned about how to better help traumatized children, to show them God's love, and to empower them with more effective skills to live their lives once they leave our care.

We will be sharing more and more about this model as we implement it over the next three years. One of the first things we implemented is the "seven commitments".

We are committed to:

- Growth & Change
- Open Communication
- Social Learning
- Democracy
- Social Responsibility
- Non-Violence
- Emotional Intelligence

We ask that you continue to pray for the children and staff as we move forward in this endeavor.

was only 12 years old, but I can still remember a Taco Bell dinner before church on a Wednesday night with my parents and the Herren family. Larry, Sharilyn, and their 3 children were coming to visit campus and considering the role of houseparenting. After prayerful consideration, they joined the Shults-Lewis family in November of 1991 as houseparents and Larry joined the maintenance team.

Larry and Sharilyn were amazing houseparents. They provided a Christ-centered home full of love, compassion, and laughter. The Herrens were master pranksters with the girls in Home 4, proving that sometimes laughter really is the best medicine.

As their kids got older, the Herrens decided to move out of houseparenting. However, they stayed a part of the Shults-Lewis ministry as Larry continued on as Maintenance Supervisor and Sharilyn accepted the position of the school secretary.

> With Larry's extensive knowledge and understanding of maintenance and IT, he has kept this campus (7 homes, a school, and an office building) in excellent shape.

He has saved the agency untold amounts of money as he was able to fix just about anything that went wrong. I can't tell you how many thousands of texts and messages I have sent to Larry—my ceiling's leaking, my computer is freaking out, there's a flood in the basement.... and I'm just one of 30 people who are constantly

saying, "help, Larry" and he always did. From ISTEP testing, to school picture taking, to grades & report cards, and everything in between, Sharilyn has kept the school running smoothly. Sharilyn

worked with the kids on their computer skills and their photography skills. Her photography class taught our kids to see the beauty God places all around us. A quiet and humble servant, Sharilyn went above and beyond in every aspect of her job.

I have literally known the Herrens my entire life as Sharilyn was my dad's secretary when he was a minister in Michigan B.B. (Before Beth). They have been amazing examples of a Christian husband and wife team who truly serve God together. I have enjoyed every fishing and hunting story with Larry in the kitchen and every shared video of the Grandkids from Sharilyn. I am blessed to know them and we are all so thankful for their nearly 26 vears of service to children and families.
