Leading Shults Lewis Child and Family Services is like riding down the remote country road right outside my office window. I can see some beauty, the sun is shining, the cool breeze is moving the colorful trees and then I see farmers at work. Since winter has passed, they are making changes to the soil and making sure that everything is healthy and well. With that I see a dream of creating a home, an atmosphere where children are safe, their behaviors are addressed in a patient manner and they are respected, loved and valued. Like the farmer, we seek to bring out the incredible beauty that lies within the life of all children we serve. These children are precious gems created in the image of God and they are very special.

When the phone rings at Shults Lewis Child and Family Services, most times the urgency is great and the cry sounds like, "Help! Help! Help!" I am familiar with that desperation call in the voice of agencies who are seeking a residential placement and parents who have done everything they know, but their child still needs help. Because the need is so severe, we are in the approval process with the Department of Childs Services to become not just a residential program, but a Qualified Residential Treatment Program. The children of today have greater needs than before. Specialized training is needed for this type of program and we have begun working on it. We are excited to open our doors to another population of children who need our help. We are accepting referrals! Please free to give us a call at 219-462-0513. I am diligently at work with my staff and department heads to make changes necessary to accommodate these childcare opportunities with the love and example of Jesus for the hurting hearts of children. In the child caring industry, we have realized life becomes difficult quickly for children who have been traumatized. Another change we have made to help the children we serve is to bring dogs and horses to our campus. Research has validated the beautiful connection and comfort these animals bring in the lives of children. Our kids love being around these animals! They laugh and smile as if they don't have a care in the world.

School Happenings

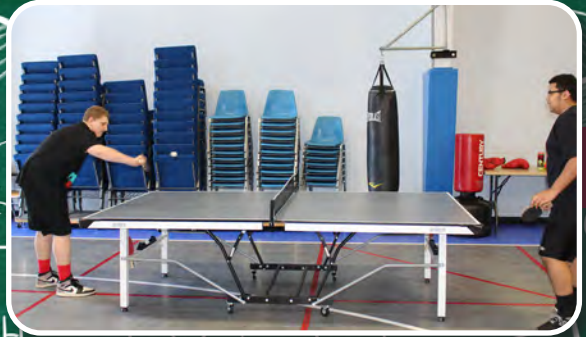

The children are receiving individual, family and group sessions throughout the week, supervised by a Licensed Clinical Therapist. Did you know we offer on-campus education and GED prep, case management services, monthly psychiatric treatment with medication management as well as a variety of evidence-based therapy techniques? We meet the needs of

the residents through trauma-informed care, independent living skills, therapy groups, all with a Bible-based approach.

Staff is trained on a regular basis on topics relating to trauma, behavioral health, psychoeducation, and self-care from a Biblical perspective. Group care of children at Shults-Lewis is a team effort involving skilled professionals working together, including houseparents, therapy staff, case management staff, educational staff, and administrative support staff. Suffice to say that we couldn't do what we do without your support!

Who says kids can't horse around? Shults Lewis Child & Family Services is pleased to be able to add EQUINE THERAPY for our residents! We've recently partnered with True North Training Stables in Chesterton, IN to allow our residents to work with

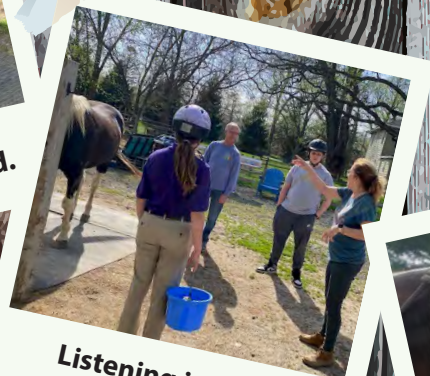
and ride their horses.

True North provides a safe environment where at risk youth and their families come for training in life skills and spiritual awareness in an equine setting. This includes, but is not limited to, children who struggle with depression, autism, foster/adopted, ADD, ADHD, self-harm, bullied, addiction, sexual abuse, incarcerated parents, eating disorders, truancy, and other similar society issues. We instruct our students through an eight-week program covering the following character qualities: relationship building; teamwork and leadership; respect; patience, perseverance and strength; focus; communication; critical thinking, decision making, discernment, and conflict resolution; and trust. Five of our residents began the program in April and got to pick their horse, "My horse is sky!", "I have sun! One of the residents was so excited about the program that when I asked her to tell me about it, all she could say was "fun!" Residents learn to groom and take care of the horses thereby building a bond of healing.

Day of Prayer and Giving

JUNE 25, 2023

This year, **Day of Prayer and Giving** will be held on June 25, 2023. In 2023, we want to continue to tackle some BIG items off our list. The first item we need to purchase is new computers for our campus. Our current computers will not support the new operating system in 2024. We have been obtaining quotes from vendors and are looking at about \$18,000 to transition to new computers for our administrative offices and our school.

The second item we need to complete is seal coating the asphalt in our parking lots by the school, administration building and homes. Seal coating protects the asphalt from damage and prolongs the life of the asphalt pavement. Estimated cost for seal coating is \$12,000.

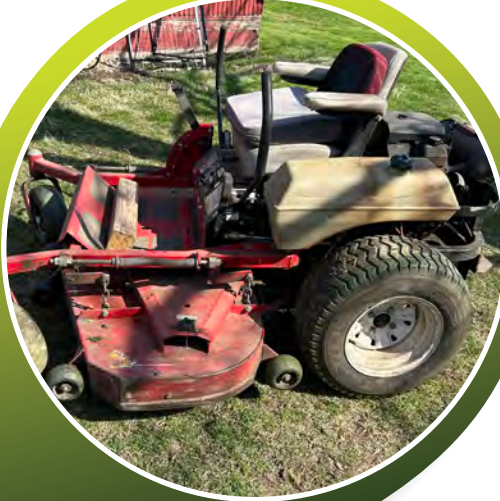
The third item we need to purchase is a new zero turn lawn mower. Currently, our maintenance staff has 7 acres of property to mow each week. Our mower is over 30 years old. A zero turn mower will cost about \$15,000.

The fourth item we need to purchase is new floors for the bedrooms in our residential homes. The carpet is very old and needs to be replaced. Estimated cost of materials and labor is \$7,000.

The fifth item we need is a sidewalk from Home 7 to the school. Currently, the kids need to walk through the field to get to the school. Snow and rain make for a wet track to the school. This is a safety issue. Estimated cost for this capital improvement is \$12,100.

The last item we need is new gym equipment for the kids. The dumbbells are falling apart due to wear and tear. Exercise is important to promoting a healthy resident. Estimated cost to replace new gym equipment is \$5,200.

Our financial goal is \$69,300. Thank you in advance for your prayers and gifts as we continue to help kids who face trauma. Your prayers and gifts can make a difference in a child's life!

Development News - Embracing Change

Embracing change is my goal for the development department. I started my new position as Director of Finance and Development in January. Accounting has always been my passion; it is black and white. Numbers are clearly defined and reflect the facts. However, something was missing in my life. I wanted to help others and make a difference in a child's life. My gift was compassion for others. God was calling me to put my gifts into action and development provided me the opportunity and means to work with donors, kids, and staff to build this department with refreshing ideas and engagement with donors.

In January, as we embraced change, we welcomed Tim Deem former Vice President from Mount Dora Children's Home to consult with us in development. His ideas were refreshing and his knowledge and training were invaluable. I walked away with a greater understanding of the tasks in front of me and the importance of strengthening my relationships with our donors. Our kids are "our cause" and God calls us to help serve these kids who have experienced trauma.

February kicked off our Annual Phone Campaign with pre-pledges. Vendors that we do business with were contacted during the month and asked to partner with us during the Phone Campaign. This was a new initiative in development. With the help of God, we nailed it! Over 50% of our vendors pledged money for the phone campaign. This was truly amazing!

In March, eight churches volunteered to host a phone campaign night. Four of these churches were new to the phone campaign trail. Thank you to the following churches and volunteers from: West Chicago Church of Christ, Waterford Church of Christ, Park Forest Church of Christ, LaGrange Church of Christ, Whiteland Church of Christ, Naperville Church of Christ, Northwest Church of Christ and Worth Church of Christ. Without their participation, we would not have been able to meet and exceed our goal of \$125,000. I am excited to announce that our 2023 Phone Campaign generated \$187,020.56 in pledges this year. Thank you donors for your generous support and continued blessing to the kids we serve. No child is turned away for the inability to pay.

Our development department embraced new change in staff this year. Kiana Baldwin resigned after 10 years in development and has moved onto a new adventure. We wish her all the best in her new career! In February, Jasmine Lindley joined our development team as development assistant. In April, we welcomed Sarah Turnmire to our team as she shares work in both the executive and development departments. God has truly blessed me by surrounding me with with such wonderful staff.

At the end of April, we welcomed the youth group from Whiteland Church of Christ. The youth group worked with residents and staff mulching our garden beds, boxing ink cartridges and cleaning scuff marks off the gymnasium floor! We enjoyed laughing and working together in the soil. In the evening, we were invited to pizza at Gelsosomo's and the Super Mario Brothers movie. On Sunday, we were blessed to worship with the youth group at Wheatfield Church of Christ. It was a fun day for all!

I would like to invite all churches to come and visit with their youth groups this summer. This is a great opportunity for youth to interact with residents and staff as they work on campus.
