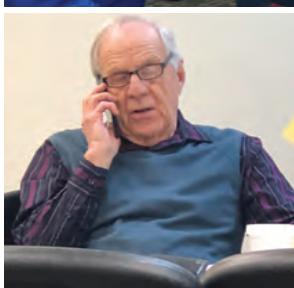
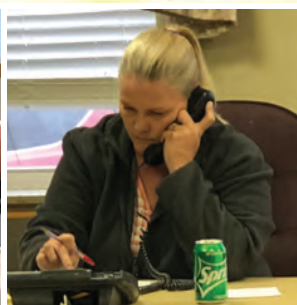
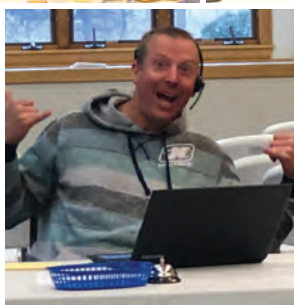

Be Still

Wow, has this year become chaotic or what! As I was deciding on what to write for this quarter's Telegram, a verse came to me that I think is especially appropriate during this time of unrest. Psalms 46:10 states, "Be still and know that I am God; I will be honored by every nation, I will be honored throughout the world." If ever there was a time for our world to "Be still", I do believe it's now.

Our world is very intentional in telling people to be strong, be assertive, don't show weakness or the world will devour you. Sadly, we find people doing "all the work" and giving God none of the credit. They believe that by "taking courage" and by "lifting up their hands", they can survive by the sweat of their own brow; they can do it all on their own, without any divine guidance.

Be still and know that I am God: we must continue fulfilling our responsibilities and living our lives but the uncertainties of living in a world of sin and woe will continually challenge us. James 4:13-17 tells us that our lives are like a vapor, here for a little while and then vanishes away. We should be saying "If the Lord wills, I will do this and that". Personal resourcefulness is no substitute for reliance upon God. The command "be still" forces us to think about two things: 1) we are finite beings, 2) God is infinite.

So what does all this have to do with the COVID-19 crisis we are currently facing? We need to "chill-out" and relax. Now that isn't to say we shouldn't do what we are supposed to do during this time. We should be following the guidelines of our governor, the CDC, and all the other medical professionals that are working to stop the spread of the virus and find us a cure. We have to do our part in navigating these uncertain times. But we should be able to experience a spiritual calm; a calm that does not come from a lack of troubles. It comes from a steady, deep reflection on the ways God has intervened in history on behalf of his people.

Recently, after our morning devotional with the residents, I spoke to everyone about what the corona virus is, signs and

symptoms, and what to do to help prevent the spread of the virus. I tried to speak in language the kids could understand and without causing them to be overly alarmed. When I asked if they had any questions, one young lady raised her hand and asked, "Since you said the virus can be spread by being in contact with people who have traveled overseas, my sister just went to Minnesota. Am I going to get the virus now since I have had contact with her?" Another young lady raised her hand and asked, "My family was in Kentucky recently and had to cross over water to get to where they were going. Are they going to get the virus?" Both of these questions were meant sincerely and honestly. I further explained and clarified what "overseas" meant; I definitely wanted to calm any fears these residents had about them and/or their families contracting this virus.

In our jobs here at Shults-Lewis, we are an example to these kids of what God's love truly is. They see every emotion that crosses our face; they see every action that we engage in. They are absorbing every aspect of our life to see how we live, behave, and how that impacts our actions and our thinking. As our world may seem to be crumbling around us, don't flinch in your faith in God. Stand still – not because you are the most composed person in the face of disaster, but because of what you know about God. Our kids need to see this calmness, this "stillness" that only comes from God. It is "God's past" that provides calm for "our future". He is the ruler of this earth and the all-powerful Creator of the Universe.

May we all remember that through our prayers, contributions and devotion to this work, we can touch the hearts of those who need us more than ever.

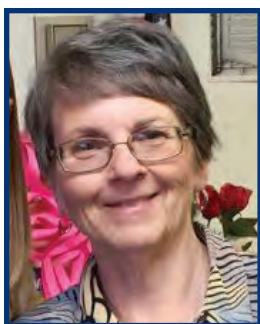


HOUSE PARENTS NEEDED

We are coming off of spring break. During spring break the children made the best of the situation that we are currently experiencing with the Covid-19. My wife, Marci and I, have enjoyed spending some time in the homes with the kids. When it was too cold outside, the kids found creative ways to get some exercise in. The girls played a lot of Wii games. The boys played some pool, but also enjoyed watching some movies.

We need to remember the words of our Lord as recorded in Matthew 19:26, "...but with God all things are possible." The apostle Paul wrote to the church at Philippi, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me," (Philippians 4:13). Both of these verses should bring us comfort. Every day we start our day together with a morning devotional and assembly before the school day begins. We try to give everyone, but especially the children, positive and encouraging messages to start their day off. We have, with that idea, tried to keep the homes in some sense of normalcy. We want that to continue during these times. God is allowing us to continue to do what we are doing because we truly love what we do. We will continue to do this work as long as God allows us to do it.

We are so thankful for you, our donors. I know there have been messages that have come in to the office wanting to know if everyone is safe. We are being diligent to keep the staff and children safe. We have shut down campus, allowing no one to come or go, not even for visits for the kids. It is a difficult time, but I believe if the adults can keep a positive attitude then the children will stay positive as well.

As for the houseparents, they are the backbone of what we do. We have continued our training in the Trust Based

Relational Intervention (TBRI) curriculum. I have heard comments from the houseparents and other staff that have taken the training that they are enjoying the training. This training allows our staff to have the tools necessary to work with children from "hard places." Working with the children that we work with can be mentally exhausting. Nonetheless, it is very rewarding. Knowing that we can show these children Christ-like behaviors and attitudes and seeing the children realize that we have their best interest at heart is extremely rewarding.

The summer is right around the corner. I have only enjoyed one summer here at Shults-Lewis, but I know that the staff and kids get excited about the summer months. We had a great time last summer interacting with various church groups. It is so encouraging for all of us when groups come to campus, help with various tasks, but also the excitement and joy they all bring is contagious. We are looking forward to the "all clear to move about the country" which will allow us to open our doors to you all again.

We do not know what lies ahead in this world, but we do know who is in control. This idea should bring us comfort, knowing that we serve a God who loves us and cares for us. It is Peter that wrote, "Casting all your care upon him, for he careth for you," (1 Peter 5:7). God wants to hear from us. Please continue to pray for the children and the staff here at Shults-Lewis.
