This was devastating news both to me personally as well as for Shults-Lewis. I have known Beth ever since she was a young girl. Beth grew up here at Shults-Lewis; her mom was a houseparent for MANY years and her dad was a Housedad as well as our Development Director. So in memory of Beth, I would like to just list some of the things I remember the most about my friend and my fellow colleague.

- Beth always had a way of making me – or really anyone for that matter – feel like I was the most important person in the world.
- Beth was a plethora of knowledge. If anyone ever had a question about Shults-Lewis or why we did something a particular way, Beth always knew the "why" behind the reason.
- Beth was a dedicated Christian, first and foremost. Sometimes we would talk about her daily devotions and what she was studying in the Bible for that month. I always greatly admired her commitment to God and His service.
- Beth was dedicated and committed to the work at Shults-Lewis. We used to tease her and say that she ate, breathed and slept Shults-Lewis. I once told her she should just stay in one of the homes on campus to save on gas money!

When I was promoted to Program Director and moved over to the school



building, Beth would come over almost every day and ask "How's the world of social services going?"

- Beth would often tell me, "You worry about getting the kids here and I will take care of the money side of things".
- Beth was a kind person. Although she would often tell me I was too soft on people, she never hesitated to help anyone that needed her, no matter what time it was or what she had to do to help; she would always be there.
- Beth was an organized person. I was always amazed at how much she could accomplish in one day.

My list could go on and on but I believe anyone who was ever around Beth would agree that she was a very special person. She is missed dearly and no one will ever be able to replace her. It does give me comfort, however, to know she is in a better, safer place especially with all this COVID-19 business going on.

Beth may be gone from us physically, but she will always be close in our hearts. I love you girl!!

Beth left behind a legacy of hospitality and hard work. If you worked for Beth, you "Do it right or do it twice". You were the first ones to show up and the last ones to leave.




She made sure all of our visitors felt like they were a part of something special.

This one I can attest to, even in the Administrators meetings, if there was an opportunity to try and make people laugh, she took that opportunity. Those meetings simply are not the same without her. There is a huge hole here at Shults-Lewis that only Beth Frump could fill. Beth, you truly are missed our dear friend. Until we meet again for eternity.
